

AURA application preview

The Advanced Undergraduate Research Award (AURA) supports upper-division undergraduate students engaged in independent research, creative, or scholarly projects (outside of a regular course) conducted under the mentorship of a faculty member. Each selected student will receive a \$1,000 award, with up to \$500 in additional funding available to support project-related expenses. At the time of application, students must have earned a minimum of 60 credit hours (junior or senior standing), with at least the final 12 credits completed at Buffalo State. Preference will be given to full time students with strong academic records and to those with a previous record of success in EURO. AURA awardees are required to present their work at the Spring Student Showcase. When appropriate, students are encouraged to earn academic credit for their research, creative, or scholarly project. Students receiving an AURA award are not eligible for a Small Grant Awards during the same semester. The number of awards is dependent on available funding. Student applications deadlines are available on the Undergraduate Research website.
